

The State of North Carolina Bans Plastic Bottles, Oil Filters and Pallets From All Landfills In The State Beginning October 1, 2009

The following materials are currently banned from disposal in landfills.

LEAD-ACID BATTERIES	ABC BEVERAGE CONTAINERS	ANTIFREEZE
ALUMINUM CANS	OYSTER SHELLS	APPLIANCES
