Nursery and Farrowing Cleaning

Significant Aspects:

Animal Waste
Excess Sludge Accumulation

Potential Environmental Impacts:

Land, surface water, ground water, air quality

Work activities seek to protect against animal stress or loss, reduce lagoon loading, improve indoor air quality, and seek to prevent emergencies such as fire.

Report anything unusual to farm manager. Examples include if water is not heating, any frayed electrical cords, rust in equipment or wire floors, fuel leaks on pressure washer.

In both nursery and farrowing, after pigs are removed from rooms, clean dust off shutters, fans and heater with an air hose.

- In both nursery and farrowing barns, unplug heaters and wrap with plastic to protect from water damage.
- In farrowing house, remove heat lamps from room. Check to make sure heat mats are unplugged.

Hose down room (wet with hose) using fresh cold water. This softens any dirt for easier removal.

Check fuel supply line to diesel heated pressure washer to check for leaks. Turn on. Wash with high pressure, hot water pressure cleaning.

Unplug fans and wash out under low pressure. This minimizes dust on fans to prevent fire, improve indoor air quality and reduce odor.

Turn off heated pressure washer.

Disinfect with a phenoyl product to kill pathogens and then with a bleach product to complete cleaning. May include other cleaners/disinfectants as prescribed by veterinarian. Products sprayed in room with hose (liquid). Products measured based on container directions prior to use so that proper amount is used.

Allow time for room to completely dry before introducing new pigs. This allows maximum effectiveness of product.
